Borough

Pimm's Summer Cups

Pimm was a farmer's son from Kent who became the owner of an oyster bar in London, near the Bank of England. He offered the tonic (a gin-based drink containing a secret mixture of herbs and liqueurs) as an aid to digestion. Soon this beverage was mixed with lemonade and fruits and has been a Londoner favorite ever since.

Edgware Road

Spanning from Marble Arch in Northwest London through to Westminster, Edgware Road is home to the city's largest Middle Eastern quarter. Also known as "Little Beirut" it is famous for its Shawarma, kebabs, and Shisha. We feature a live charcoal grill serving a wide selection of Arabic specialties.
